

# Beware of DIGITAL ARREST SCAMS



### **Stay Calm and Do Not Panic**

Scammers use urgency to pressure victims. Remember, real law enforcement never demands money or issues arrest warrants over calls. Stay alert!



# **Verify the Caller's Identity**

If contacted by someone claiming to be from law enforcement, don't share info or pay. Hang up and verify with the agency directly.



## **Be Cautious with Unsolicited Communications**

Avoid unexpected calls, messages, or emails asking for personal or financial info. Legitimate agencies won't request sensitive details.



#### **Look for Warning Signs**

Be wary of urgent or threatening messages demanding immediate or unconventional payments - common tactics used by scammers.



#### **Educate Yourself and Others**

Stay aware of common scams and share this knowledge. Awareness is your best defense against fraud.



#### **Report Suspicious Activity**

If you suspect a scam, report it to the national cybercrime portal or Dial 1930. Prompt action can protect others from becoming victims.
